#### THE NATIVITY: EXPLORING THE "CELLARS OF THE HEART"

On the face of it, it seems strange that the Lord of Glory entered human his-

tory not in the brilliant noon of the day, amid trumpet fanfare and the acclamation of excited crowds, as is appropriate for a King. Rather, the Son of God Himself was born in silence, amid the obscurity of darkness in a cave remote and cold, in a place distant and arid.

The Christ, the Messiah, delivered in silence, as if the event transcended words and sounds, suggesting a deep mystery that could only be pondered wordlessly, in the heart. Sacred Scripture records not a word spoken by anyone that Bethlehem night.

Even the Theotokos was silent, as the poet Deland expressed so beautifully: "No sound: the mother, kneeling, lays/Her cheek against the little face./Oh human love! Oh heavenly grace!/'Tis yet in silence that she prays!"

All Mary could do was gaze into His eyes, seeking the truth that would at once console her anxiety, and give her courage to face the harsh noise of future days and that ultimate day when there would be a deafening cry from the disillusioned rabble: "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" Not by accident came the Lord of Life to the muted cloister of that cave, for from that silence He preached a resounding lesson to all who would follow Him.

In the hour when heaven touched the earth and God became man, that first moment of the encounter between Divinity and humanity, between His beneficent grace and our seeking souls, there is stillness.

Amid the frenzied activity and noise of the Christmas season, Christians would do well to consider the primacy of silence and stillness in our lives.

The Desert Fathers, those spiritual giants who steeped themselves in wordlessness, teach with one voice of the importance of stillness.

When the city dweller Abba Arsenius (350-450 AD) prayed to God asking to be shown the path to salvation, a voice came to him from Heaven saying, "Arsenios, be alone, be silent, be at rest. These are the roots of a life without sin."

In his book "In the Heart of the Desert," Fr. John Chryssavgis explains that "…silence is a way of waiting, a way of watching, and a way of listening to what is going on within us. It is a way of interiority, of stopping and

and then of exploring the cellars of the heart and the center of life."

Stillness therefore is a means of encounter with God in the human heart. When better to start the practice of being still within out heart than at Christmastide? It is a means of focusing on the true meaning of these days - the incarnation of the Word for us, and for the salvation of us all.

Yet how do we who have become accustomed to the noise, chaos and frenzy of the world imitate Abba Arsenios to find inner silence and rest?

There are three dimensions of stillness.

The first is physical - actual withdrawal from noise and the clamor of community life, setting ourselves in a place of quiet. St. Gregory of Sinai (1265-1346 AD) taught that "the practice of stillness is one thing and that of community life is another."

Start during these pre-Christmas days: find a place to physically alone for a reasonable period of time. Listen to the stillness and pray!

The second dimension of stillness is of the soul - chiefly, to refrain from speech and the need to keep making words and be surrounded by talk.

St. Thalassios the Libyan, of the 7<sup>th</sup> century AD), warns that "only spiritual conversation is truly beneficial; it is better to preserve stillness than to indulge in any other kind." Use this season to refrain from chatter, especially from idle talk and destructive gossip.

The third dimension of stillness is achieving an inward state of serenity and peace deep within the "cellars of the heart."

The most difficult to obtain, this dimension challenges us to examine what is out of balance in our souls, what is wounded, what cries to God for mercy, for rest, and for peace at last.

Have the courage this Christmas season to honestly look, fearlessly and with open eyes, within the cellar of your heart. What you discover there may well be obstructing your own sense of peace and serenity.

At that moment, dare to do that which the Lord God instructs, in Psalm 46: "Be still, and know that I am God!"

Feed the Hungry Ministry serves four shelters in the Rockville area:


Chase Shelter for men; Dorothy Day Shelter for women; Helping Hands Shelter for mothers; and children; and Rainbow Shelter for women.
